The new, the first cinema house of South India opened under the name 'The Durbur', (now) constructed in 1913 by Winifred Hester and equipped with the latest architectural style, the Electric Theatre holds a significant place in the history of cinema in Chennai, and while Madras was the theatre was closed down in 1915 and the building was first sold to the Post and Telegraph Department. Later, the building had become the Philatelic Bureau from the year 1941.

RED BUILDING, EGMORE - 600 008

The 'Red Building' in Egmore, Chennai, completed its century in 2012 and is a significant example of Victorian County Colonial architecture with its three-storey structure, built in 1912 on a 5.14-acre site. It features a two-storey structure with colonial design details like arched windows, arched doorways, cast-iron grilles, and iron pillars. The entrance porch shows cast-iron support elements, including an iron pillar topped by a lion's head. The building was designed by a team of architects including J. B. Chubbuck, J. C. G. G. and the architect J. B. Chubbuck. It reflects the architectural style and planning of the British colonial era.
